The Innovation Authority will be chaired by the CM while Deputy Chief Minister CN Ashwath Narayan, who is also the IT&BT minister, will

be its co-chairman.

The vision group for startups "will provide insights on strengthening the startup ecosystem, involving key stakeholders from industry and academia," Yediyurappa said at a breakfast meeting with industry captains that was attended by the likes of Infosys cofounder Kris Gopalakrishnan among others.
